The Stone Age was when early humans used tools from stone. This lasted until the Bronze Age. The Bronze Age began when settlers arrived from Europe to Britain. These settlers brought with them ways of making tools from metal (bronze). The Iron Age lasted from 800 BC till the Roman invasion (AD 43) - This was when people used tools made from iron. With the end of the Prehistory era, the AD era began.
