

Dear Mrs Johnston,

I would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on the very high progress that pupils in your school demonstrated and the standard of achievement demonstrated in the reading, writing and mathematics Key Stage 2 assessments last year.

Your school's results, as published on 14 December, show that 97 per cent of pupils reached or exceeded the expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics at the end of Key stage 2. This means that for achievement in reading, writing and mathematics, St Anne's Catholic Primary School, Streetly is in the top 1 per cent of primary schools in the country.

Your school's results show progress scores of 5.3, 4.9 and 4.8 in reading, writing and mathematics respectively. This means that in terms of the progress you make between Key Stage 1 and the end of Key Stage 2, your school is in the top 5 per cent of primary schools in the country.

The government wants to ensure that every child has the fluency in reading and mathematics necessary to prepare them for a successful secondary education and beyond, which is why I was delighted to see your results.

Thank you for your work in continuing the drive towards higher academic standards, and congratulations again to you and your staff for your commitment and success.
