

**ARCHDIOCESE OF BIRMINGHAM  
PARISH BOUNDARIES  
SAINT ANNE, STREETLY, WEST MIDLANDS**

*Interpretation of Boundaries:*

1. *A house or institution belongs to the parish holding the road or side of the road into which opens its principal entrance.*
2. *A cul-de-sac, crescent, etc., having official opening(s) only onto one road belongs to the parish holding the road or side of the road having such official opening(s), unless the contrary be expressly stated.*
3. *The boundary always follows the middle of roads, lanes, footpaths, rivers, etc., unless stated otherwise.*

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Starting in the north at the junction of the Railway Line with the Chester Road:

- (1) South along CHESTER ROAD to Little Hardwick Road (both sides);
- (2) West along LITTLE HARDWICK ROAD to Erdington Road (both sides);
- (3) South along ERDINGTON ROAD to Beacon Hill (Foley Road) (both sides);
- (4) West along BEACON HILL to Beacon Road (both sides);
- (5) South along BEACON ROAD to Bridle Lane;
- (6) East along BRIDLE LANE to Doe Bank Lane;
- (7) South-east along DOE BANK LANE to Queslett Road East (Lindens Road);
- (8) North-east along QUESLETT ROAD EAST to Thornhill Road;
- (9) North-north-east along THORNHILL ROAD to Rosemary Hill Road and Hardwick Road;
- (10) West along HARDWICK ROAD to the Railway Line;
- (11) North-west along the RAILWAY LINE to the Chester Road.
