In 1820 Florence Nightingale was born and in 1854 she went to Crimea to help the soldiers at war.

injured- when your body has been hurt

infection- an illness caused by germs

jamaica- an island country in the Caribbean sea

patient- someone who is ill in hospital

shelter – a place to stay/live

soldier- someone who fights in a war/battle

typhoid- a type of infection

Victorian- during the time of Queen Victoria

wounded- when you are cut/injured
