School Uniform Checklist 2025/26

The Governing Body of St Anne's Catholic Primary School requires that all pupils wear the prescribed uniform (as detailed below) because we feel that uniform ties the pupils together and shows that we are one family. This list is the uniform of the school and if an item of clothing is not listed then it is not uniform and should not be worn. By seeking admission to St Anne's Catholic Primary School you are also agreeing to support the policies of the school.

All branded uniform is available at Clive Mark in Boldmere and online, they are the sole supplier (at this time) of our required logo items. They operate a 'reformed' scheme for these items, that are approx. one third of the cost of new items. School has a range of good quality second hand branded items in stock (please contact Mrs. Miller). We would advise parents to purchase any other uniform elements from suppliers who demonstrate the principles of social justice.

Uniform List -

• **Boys**

- Brown sweat shirt with our school badge
- Grey trousers
- White shirt (long or short sleeves) □

School Tie (from Year 3 only - NOT the elasticated version, it must be a proper school tie and must be worn with the school white shirt).

- Reception and KS1 elasticated tie.
- White, grey or black socks.
- Black shoes not trainers

Girls

- Brown cardigan with our school badge
- Brown pinafore (Reception and KS1)
- Brown Skirt (KS2)
- White shirt (long or short sleeves) □
- Reception and KS1 elasticated tie. □

School Tie (from Year 3 only - NOT the elasticated version, it must be a proper school tie).

- Brown tights
- **Footwear** - Black sensible shoes (no trainers allowed). □

Outdoor Clothes - Wellington boots (for outdoor activities and Forest School work) □

Hair - Long hair in a plait, bun or pony tail/s at all times to minimise exposure to head lice. Please note the long hair rule applies to boys and girls ☐

School Book Bag required for all children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 & Year 4. Pupils do not need another bag or rucksacks in these classes.

Water Bottle - all children must have their own water bottle to use during the day and at lunchtime

In the Summer term (From Easter each year, we have an optional Summer uniform)

Boys

- White polo shirt with school logo
- White Short Sleeve Shirt - no tie
- Grey short trousers (must be to the knee)

PE kit (Please remember that PE is compulsory and requires the following kit) As the children wear their PE Kit throughout the day it is imperative that parents adhere to the school uniform policy.

- Trainers for PE NO black plimsolls
- White logo t shirt (Clive Mark sell with our school badge) □
black shorts (no other colours) □

black tracksuit bottoms are allowed in winter months (no football or fashion clothing allowed, no tracksuits with logos)

Please label all items of clothing with labels that can be sewn in to avoid loss.

The school accepts no responsibility for loss of uniform

No jewellery allowed including earrings (no studs and no earring retainers) □

Please ensure that you get ears pierced at the beginning of the summer holidays to allow enough time for the hole to remain open without retainers

Pupils that wear earrings to school will be asked to remove them or you will be telephoned to come and remove them

for PE Lessons

No nail polish or make up is allowed

Pupils arriving in make up or nail polish will be asked to remove it and will be provided with materials to do so

No extreme haircuts are allowed for boys or girls

If the Head Teacher deems the haircut to be extreme you will be asked to rectify it at the hairdresser/barber please understand the need for reasonable hair styles and avoid trying to debate the issue, it is a rule and will be followed □

It is recommended that boys do not have a number 1 or less on their hair and do not cut designs/tram lines into their hair.

Pupils are not allowed to colour their hair during term time and any colours added for fun etc must be gone before pupils return to school
